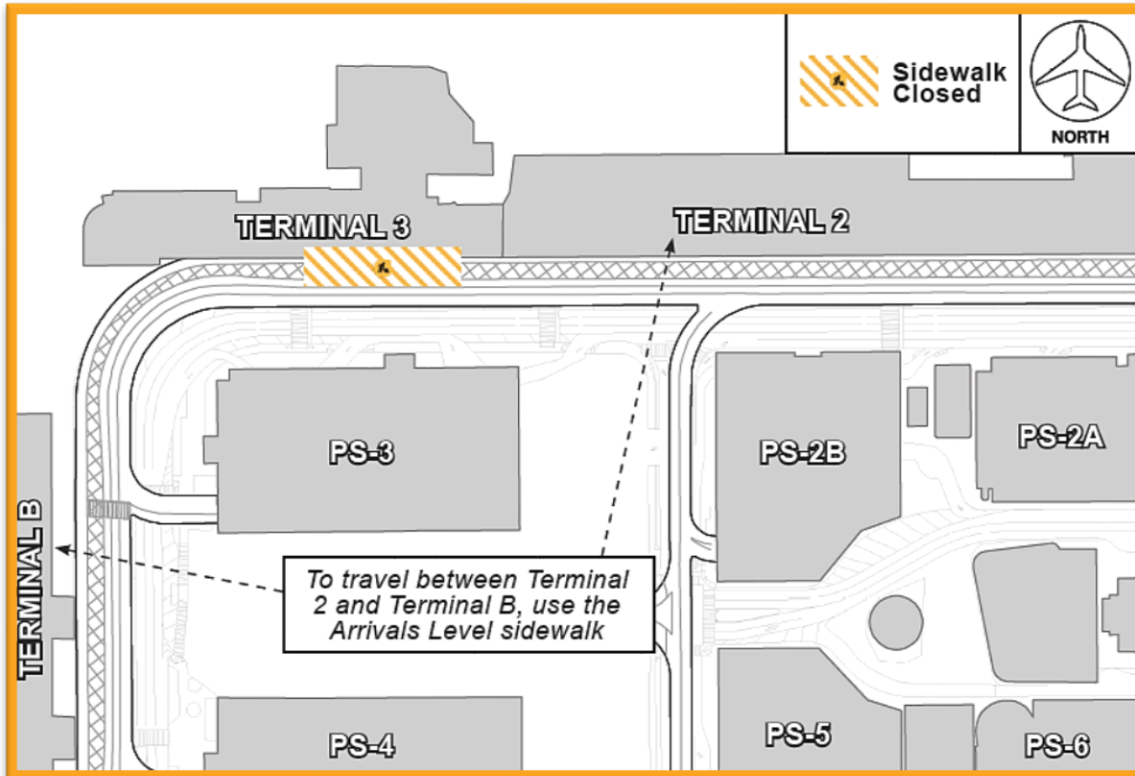


Construction Hot Topics

1. Terminal 3: Pedestrian Bridge Demolition

- The pedestrian bridge between Terminal 3 & Parking Structure 3 is scheduled to be demolished November 11 - 12, 2020 as part of the Automated People Mover project
- Currently the Departures Level sidewalk at Terminal 3 is closed nightly to facilitate soft demolition activity; temporary wayfinding is in place directing guests to the Arrivals Level
- During both nights of structural demolition (11/11 & 11/12), vehicular and pedestrian detours will be in place, including for shuttle operations; temporary signage will be in place



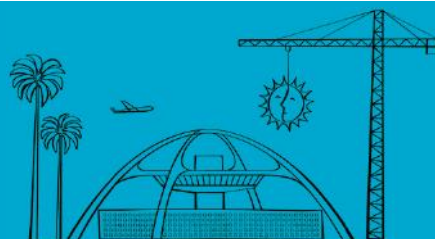
Departures Level sidewalk closure

2. Construction Update: Airport Police Facility

- Construction continues on the Airport Police Facility (APF) with the parking deck nearing completion (*pictured right*)
- Ongoing exterior construction includes the installation of glass curtain walls and the roofing system, while inside the building crews are installing mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and fire sprinkler piping
- The APF headquarters building is scheduled to be complete Summer 2021; the parking structure is scheduled to open later this year



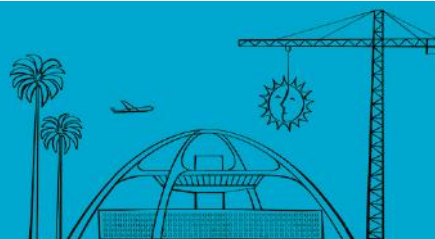
APF Parking Deck

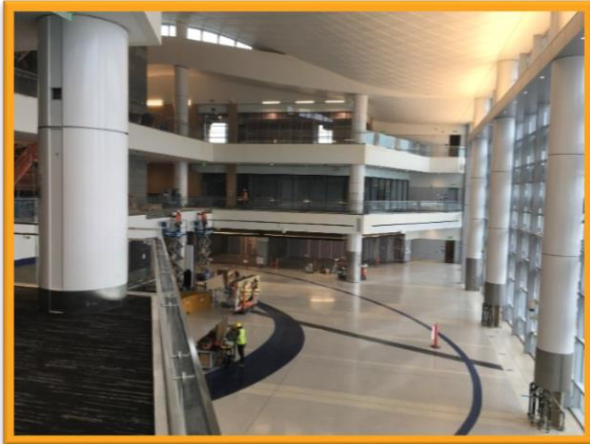

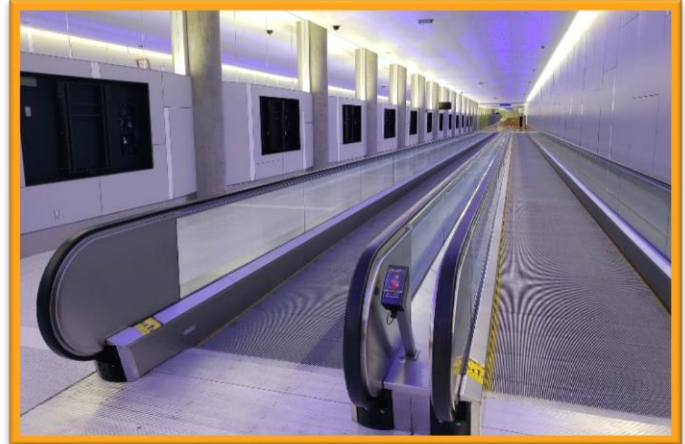

3. Construction Update: Midfield Satellite Concourse

- Construction of MSC North is nearing the finish line with substantial completion scheduled for Q4 2020
- Inside the future new concourse, work is ongoing to install signage, furniture, advertising, light fixtures and more, while gate fit activates continue airside and the passenger tunnels undergo final testing
