


CONSTRUCTION HOT TOPICS

TERMINAL 4 PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE **CLOSURE & DEMO**

As part of the Automated People Mover project, the existing pedestrian bridge between Parking Structure 4 and Terminal 4 will be demolished and removed throughout September and October 2024. To facilitate this work, the pedestrian bridge is now closed and will not re-oepn. Alternate routes and detour signage are in place between T-4 and PS-4.

STREET CLOSURE: 96TH ST EAST OF AIRPORT BLVD **CLOSED SEP. 13 - 16**

To facilitate flatwork at the intersection, 96th St east of Airport Blvd will be fully closed beginning Friday, September 13 at 9PM through Monday, September 16 at 8AM. Additionally, one lane on northbound Airport Blvd will also be closed to facilitate this work; traffic in both directions on Airport Blvd will be maintained at all times. Flaggers and signage will be in place to facilitate vehicular and pedestrian traffic.



PLEASE NOTE:

96th St between Vicksburg Ave and 96th Pl is eastbound only; 96th St between 96th Pl and Airport Blvd is closed for other APM construction activities. Vehicles exiting 96th Pl to Airport Blvd must turn right to southbound Airport Blvd. Local access remains maintained for businesses at this area.











#3 **SEPTEMBER 2024: 24/7** CTA LANE RESTRICTIONS

The map below is a collective snapshot of all scheduled 24/7 lane restrictions for CTA Departures and Arrivals Level Roadways for the month of September 2024.

PLEASE NOTE:

This map only reflects 24/7 continuous lane closures in the CTA: other nightly lane closures / sidewalk restrictions may be in place to facilitate construction activities.

ACCESS MAINTAINED:

Traffic around the Central Terminal Area will be maintained at all times, as well as access to passenger pick-up and drop-off.

PLAN AHEAD:

Motorists should plan ahead for potential delays.
